



The Annual Parish Meeting of St Dennis Parish Council Thursday 22nd May 2025

1. Introduction and Welcome

3. The presentation of the Good Citizen Award 2024 - 2025.

Liz and Steve Bradbury could not be present to accept the award but provided an acceptance speech which was read by Cllr Clarke.

4. To approve Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on the 18th April 2024

The minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on the 18th April 2024 were approved. All in favour.

5. Short Report from Cornwall Councillor Mr Dick Cole

CC Cole briefly outlined a few additional points as below:

- Funding secured over the past year for the purchase of the ClayTAWC building.
- Securing a Local Lettings Plan for St Dennis and St Enoder.

CC Cole advised that a recent Planning application for a Solar Farm at Trevice is currently being sent to Committee for determination.

Cllr Clarke thanked CC Cole for his assistance to the Parish Council over the past year and congratulated CC Cole on being re-elected as Cornwall Councillor for St Denis and St Enoder Electoral Division.

6. A report from the Police on crime statistics over the past year.

PCSO Alison Relf gave the following report:

The St Austell Neighbourhood team currently comprises of 1 Police Sergeant (PS) known as a Neighbourhood Team Leader (NTL) 5 Police Officers known as Neighbourhood Beat Managers (MBM), 4 Police Community Support Officers (PCSO) and 1 Tri-Service Safety Officer (TSSO).

The Neighbourhood Inspector responsible for the St Austell area is currently Inspector Simon Andrews.

PC Steph Tan, PC Danielle Moore Dunstan, PC Yasmin Vokes, PCSO Alison Relf and PCSO Steve Tibbles are the neighbourhood officers responsible for the parishes outside of St Austell. They are assisted by TSSO Lewis Rosewell currently operating from St Dennis Fire Station.

There have been a number of changes to the neighbourhood team over the past 12 months. PS Ian Chambers, the former NTL, was successful in being promoted to inspector. His replacement PS Martin Easter has recently joined the team following 5 years as a Custody Sergeant based in Newquay. Prior to this Martin was a Patrol Officer based out of St Austell for 9 years.

The team now have 3 new PCSO's who joined in April and are currently undergoing a period of tutorship prior to being deployed into the community. There is the intention that two of the PCSO's will be deployed to parishes outside of St Austell.

We are currently waiting for information from the Police and Crime Commissioner in regards to funding for additional NBM'S.

The team also works closely with Cornwall Council Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Team and the ASB housing teams working for the various social housing associations with housing stock in the area to deal with ASB and low level crime.

St Dennis Crime Information from March 2024 – March 2025

A total of 150 crimes were reported during this period broken down as shown below;

8. Invitation to the public to raise any matters of interest or concerns.

No matters were raised by members of the public.

Cllr A Griffin raised concerns reported to her and it was agreed that this would be discussed further with the police.

9. Chairman's Annual Report

At the recent elections only 6 Parish Councillors completed and submitted their forms – therefore all 6 were duly elected to form the new Parish Council for the next 4 years. We have 11 seats allocated to St Dennis so therefore we are hoping that more residents will show an interest to go through the co-option process to fill the 5 seats and become Councillors.

As you can imagine with 5 seats vacant the current Councillors are having to work harder to complete the work which comes forward.

You will shortly be hearing reports from all of our Parish Council Committees which will update you on some of the items we have been working on over the last year.

The item that has kept us very busy and has cost you the Council tax payers has been the criminal damage caused by person or persons unknown.

This has included:-

The destruction of an aluminium sign by the skate park costing in the region of £400,

The intentional damage to works which had just been carried out to repair the bank by the skatepark,

Removal of a sign at Freda's Triangle, deserted bicycles,

Scooters and clothing in the playing field, and the damage to Perspex sheets in the bus shelters.

There are too many to list here this evening

This all cost us, the tax payers, a lot of money every year.

On road and inconsiderate parking is always at the forefront – the Parish council are constantly reporting issues to the Police and County Highways – we will continue this work. A lot of the problems are created by people purchasing houses without off road parking – I have no idea how we overcome that.

The Parish Council are still working, with solicitors, to complete the purchase of the land at Dunstan Close. Hopefully this will be concluded soon and we will be able to clear the area and plant trees etc for public benefit.

I wish to thank our Parish Clerk – Lynn and our two administrators - Tamsyn and Jess for the sterling work they carry out on a day to day basis to keep the Parish working. I cannot forget our 3 part time maintenance workers, Brian, David and Alfie who play a big role in

keeping the village tidy, also maintaining the cemetery and playing field and cutting back the footpaths. Without those chaps the village would be in a horrid mess. Also our thanks go to our Cornwall Councillor Dick Cole for the massive support he gives to us.

8. Short Reports from the Committees (Planning, Cemetery, Playing Field and Education Grants)

Community Grants 2024 - 2025

Applications received: 9 applications received in 2024-25, which included funds towards the running of the art group, costs towards the community fireworks display, contribution to support St Denys Craft Club, a Darts Tournament for the under 18's, a grant towards the cost of the insurance for the Carnival Committee. A donation to St Dennis Parish Committee to assist with the D-Day celebration event. A contribution towards the over 70's Christmas lunch. As well as an annual donation to the Cornwall Air Ambulance we also donated this year £100 to the Chestnut Appeal for men's health. A total of £2232.66 was awarded under section 137 and £600 under other powers.

In addition to this we have a new memorial bench that has been donated by a member of the public and the Parish Council have ordered but not paid for or installed 3 new benches to replace the wooden benches in the parish.

A grant has been sourced for the installation of mobile speed signage project. Unfortunately, due to contractor delays this has not been completed as we would have hoped in 24 – 25. We do hope these signs, when installed, will reduce speeding within the area. The Parish Council will be able to better monitor vehicle speeds within the Parish and provide evidence of hot spots for further action.
